## **A Special Veterans' Voices Show to Reflect on 20 Years in Afghanistan**

On **Monday, September 13th, from 7 pm to 8:30 pm**, in a special 90-minute live show, Veterans' Voices will remember the events of September 11, 2001 and the twenty years of war that followed. "**9/11 – Twenty Years Later**" will be an in-depth discussion with Afghanistan Veterans, reflecting on their memories of that day and their feelings about current events in the country. Guests will include Ken De Braganca, who witnessed the events of 9/11 in New York, Marine Veteran Mike Hudson, Navy Seal Veteran Jason Tuschen, and Dan Blakely, Army Ranger Veteran and author of "The Twenty Year War." Viewers can share their own experiences or ask a question by calling into the program at 925-313-1170. They can also use that number to record a message for the panel any time before the show.
