Contra Costa County New Go-Live: February 2023

To help ensure a successful transition to CalSAWS, we are pushing back implementation of the new statewide system in Contra Costa County to early next year.

As many of you know, we are transitioning from our CalWIN system, which supports our public assistance services, to CalSAWS. To date, Los Angeles and C-IV counties have already transitioned. The 18 CalWIN counties are scheduled to transition in six waves beginning in October, 2022, with Wave 1, and ending with Wave 6 in December, 2023. We are scheduled as the first and only large county in Wave 1. There are also two small counties in Wave 1.

As you may also know, the CalSAWS transition requires considerable changes to EHSD's business processes, and significant work to convert and configure our various ancillary systems including the contact center, lobby management, task management, imaging, appointment scheduling, and others. We have a fantastic CalSAWS team who has been working with CalSAWS project leadership and supporting vendors to achieve a successful transition for our workforce and our community.

To achieve a successful transition, we need adequate support and time to fully prepare our staff and systems. As the first large CalWIN county to transition, we, along with the CalSAWS team, have been learning the full scope of what is required by counties and the CalSAWS team for success. Based on our experience to date, we and the CalWIN Consortium have come to a joint decision that we move to Wave 2 with a go-live date of February, 2023. Although I am confident that we, led by Eileen Olson, could have been ready to transition in October, 2022, I support this decision because it gives us time to be better prepared which will result in a more successful transition.

I'm extremely grateful to our whole CalSAWS team who provided me a thorough briefing upon my arrival to EHSD, and who has and continues to display excellent project management. My thanks to everyone involved with our CalSAWS transition for an unwavering commitment to ensuring quality services to our community as we journey towards CalSAWS go-live in **February 2023!**

Why is Working on the Non-Citizen Data Clean-up List Important?

Now is the time for data cleanup

Now is the time to work on the Non-Citizen Data Clean-up List. It is critical that we complete the non-citizen section codes in CalWIN in time for conversion to CalSAWS.

Eligibility Determination and Benefit Calculation (EDBC) uses the non-citizen section codes in CalSAWS. If we do not complete the section codes in CalWIN before Go-Live, they will not convert to CalSAWS. Since we are rolling benefits from the last CalWIN EDBC, benefits will continue for these non-citizens – until the next EDBC is run in CalSAWS after go-live. In CalSAWS, we must enter the section code to complete the EDBC. Otherwise, the individual will be discontinued. Note that there is no batch indicator in CalSAWS. The EDBC will run during COLA and the individual may be discontinued. Just like in CalWIN, there are many batch jobs that run in CalSAWS. The first major COLA will be the SSA COLA which is typically the first weekend in December, so we need to update the non-citizen section codes in CalWIN now because that first COLA will be upon us before we can blink at migration.



User Acceptance Testing (UAT) Phase One

EHSD staff participated in the first phase of our User Acceptance Testing (UAT) preparation phase which included script review. This first UAT phase, which took place in February and wrapped up in early March, included staff reviewing the program and business area script scenarios. Staff reviewed 50 to 100 different scenarios in each designated area. The CalSAWs Project will use these scenarios to build full scripts for our UAT

testing. Our County staff was able to review, add, and get familiar with potential scenarios being developed for our User Acceptance Testing.

For the next phase, we are gearing up to execute our UAT activities. We have recruited 14 staff members who will be testing their designated program and business areas. We will have two groups testing from the end of June through mid-August.




Mystery Revealed

We began our Bulk Export, the conversion of the majority of our documents to the new imaging system, on April 1st. That means copying documents in our current repository into storage, awaiting the transformation and importing process into the CalSAWS production environment. The bulk export documents include all through March 31, 2022. We expect to complete this process by the end of June, in time for our July 1st User Acceptance Testing (UAT).

Supplemental Exports

In addition to the Bulk Export, we will have three supplemental exports of documents with the first taking place on October 21st, 2022. This export will include documents from April 1st through September 30th, 2022. The second supplemental export will be on October 31st (documents scanned from October 1 through 27). Our third and final export will happen soon after Go-Live, and will include demographic updates, such as name changes and re-indexed documents during this period.

We will be converting approximately **34 million** documents to CalSAWS!

Change Discussion Guides
